COMPUTER ANIMATION



Please note that pieces must be animated. Entries to be a maximum of 3 minutes in length, there is no lower limit. The pieces can be any form of animation – i.e. stop motion animation, animated drawings, or using digital animation software such as ‘Scratch’. Film entries must be complete at the time of entry, uploaded to YouTube and made available for public view. They must not be amended or edited after submission.

Any necessary copyright permissions must be obtained for any music used in films or animation.

SHORT FILM



This includes any type of short film, which does not meet the criteria above for animation. Entries to be a maximum of 5 minutes in length, there is no lower limit. Film entries must be complete at the time of entry, uploaded to YouTube and made available for public view. They must not be amended or edited after submission.

Any necessary copyright permissions must be obtained for any music used in films or animation.

Film entries must be complete at the time of entry, uploaded to YouTube and available for public view. They must not be amended or edited after submission. You must have the URL in order to complete the booking form.

A high resolution still shot will be also required to accompany the entries.

DIGITAL ART



This includes any art produced using the aid of computers, tablets or other digital devices. It includes digitally enhanced or edited photography, as well as art produced using design software, or creative programmes, such as ‘Draw’. Digital art must be submitted in the form of a JPEG, maximum size 10 MB
