Luckley Sixth Form Centre is at the forefront of Sixth Form life. Set aside from the main school, the Centre provides an idyllic environment for independent and purposeful study, including silent study rooms, bespoke small-group teaching classrooms, a kitchen area and a spacious common room to relax, wind down and socialise between lessons.

Alongside this, you will have full access to the facilities in the main school, such as the modern science laboratories, outstanding music centre, show-stopping theatre and conference centre, a dedicated Sixth Form art studio and a well-equipped sports centre, with fitness suite, all weather pitch and a climbing wall. Library and careers resources are also set aside exclusively for Sixth Form students to use for study and research.

ACADEMIC FOCUS

SUPPORTING OUR STUDENTS

What sets us aside from other Sixth Forms is the in-depth, one-to-one support from teachers and tutors, and we pride ourselves on our specialist, small-group teaching. We will help you to learn how to use your time responsibly, just as you would need to do at university or in the workplace. With over 20 subject choices at A level, there are plenty of interesting options and the Head of Sixth Form will assist you in making the right choices.

INDEPENDENT LESSONS TO HELP YOU EXCEL

In addition to standard lessons, each subject has an additional independent lesson to support you further. These lessons give you the chance to consolidate what you have learned in your lessons in more extensive detail.

THE EXTENDED PROJECT QUALIFICATION (EPQ)

The EPQ gives you an opportunity to create a largely self-directed and independent project; choosing a topic, then planning, researching and developing ideas. The topic can be directly related to your main study programme, delving deeper from the set specification, or it can be something unrelated to your A level choices. The finished product may take the form of:

- A research-based written report
- A production (e.g. a charity event, fashion show or sports event etc.)
- An artefact (e.g. a piece of art, computer game, realised design etc.)

STUDENT VOICE

SPORT AND KEEPING FIT

You will have lots of opportunities to take part in sporting activities and keep fit at Luckley. All Sixth Formers enjoy an afternoon of PE every week and in this time you can choose to play fixtures or participate in recreational activities, such as ultimate frisbee, tag rugby, climbing, trampolining or tennis. Many students also use the sports centre facilities during noncontact time, which is a great way to relieve stress and enjoy that feel-good factor for the rest of the day. We are very supportive of students who have sporting interests and talents outside of school, particularly in terms of allowing time out of lessons to compete in national competitions. Over the years we have been proud of our students' talents in rowing, cricket, dancing, climbing, riding and karate, amongst others.

DRAMA

If you have a passion for drama, you can certainly express your creative talents

here with our amazing performing arts theatre. All students can take part in school productions, whether in an acting role or working behind the scenes on lighting and sound, costumes or stage management. Regular House competitions give students the chance to display any hidden talents, such as the Musical Entertainment competition. Optional speech and drama lessons are on offer resulting in high levels of success in examinations.

MUSIC

If you are musical, you will adore our state-of-the-art music centre, with its acoustically superb performance hall, high tech recording studio and bespoke practice/ tuition rooms. Senior and Chamber Choirs are always looking for new members and tuition is available in both instruments and singing. Our students' success in the Associated Board examinations is always excellent (Grades 1 - 8). The Carol Service and Spring Concert, together with more informal events such as the Christmas Cheer Concert and music masterclasses, are held throughout the year creating a rich, varied and challenging musical programme.

ENRICHMENT

The need to balance academic studies with rich and varied experiences outside the classroom is always at the forefront of our minds. Many departments arrange trips to academic lectures, conferences and theatres to complement classroom studies. Residential trips in Biology and Geography have proved very successful, as have our cultural trips to South Africa, Paris. Venice and America. to name a few. There is also a wide range of clubs and activities on offer to enable you to explore and develop your talents and passions. The Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme and Combined Cadet Forces give you the opportunity to experience outdoor adventures whilst learning some valuable life skills such as basic first aid, navigation and outdoor cooking.

PLANNING AHEAD

Year 12 students take part in a Pre-University programme. This dedicated time off timetable gives you the best possible start when it comes to planning ahead for life after Luckley. The programme includes talks from a variety of universities, employers and gap-year providers, careers and UCAS advice and valuable interview practice.

PREPARING FOR INDEPENDENT LIVING

The 'Finish Line' in Year 13 includes a range of activities, including cooking

demonstrations, car maintenance, managing finances, CV writing and work experience. Our students also attend a thoughtprovoking driver awareness training session which gives a valuable insight into the dangers of driving and how to ensure your own and others' safety when you become a driver.

AFTER LUCKLEY

We are so proud of the achievements of all our students. Over the past five years, 90% have left us to study at their first choice university, with others choosing further education courses, memorable gap years, or successful employment. The success rate has been fantastic and continues to astonish us every year and that is because we encourage our students to work hard, but also take pride in the subjects they enjoy most. THE ADMISSIONS PROCESS

ENTRY CRITERIA

Students wishing to join the Sixth Form at Luckley are expected to demonstrate the ability to achieve the minimum entry standards (six good grades at GCSE) and the potential to gain a Grade 6 at GCSE for your chosen subjects, with a Grade 7 in the Sciences or Maths.

TO APPLY

You will need to complete a registration form via our website and pay a registration fee of \pounds 100.


