Luckley Sixth Form Centre is at the forefront of Sixth Form life. ACADEMIC FOCUS

BROADENING OUR CURRICULUM

To meet the needs and aspirations of a wider range of students, we will be introducing a small number of vocational qualifications alongside our existing A Level and EPQ offer. This will create a more inclusive and flexible curriculum that recognises different learning styles and strengths while maintaining high academic expectations.

By offering broader options we can ensure that more students achieve success, remain engaged in education and leave Sixth Form well prepared for their next steps, whether that is university, an apprenticeship or employment.

For the 2027 academic year we will offer the Leiths CTH Level 3 Extended Certificate in Professional Cookery which opens up a world of opportunity for students with a love of cookery. Supporting learners

to explore all areas of the food industry, this course opens doors and helps students to explore their potential across a range of skills and competencies whilst giving them up to 36 UCAS points. (Level 3 Extended Certificate Professional Cookery).

We will also look to introduce a small number of V Level qualifications in 2028.

THE EXTENDED PROJECT QUALIFICATION (EPQ)

The EPQ gives you an opportunity to create a largely self-directed and independent project; choosing a topic, then planning, researching and developing ideas. The topic can be directly related to your main study programme, delving deeper from the set specification, or it can be something unrelated to your A Level choices. The finished product may take the form of:

- A research-based written report
- A production (e.g. a charity event, fashion show or sports event etc.)
- An artefact (e.g. a piece of art, computer game, realised design etc.).

DIGITAL SKILLS FOR THE FUTURE

Regardless of your chosen career, digital literacy is becoming increasingly important. Through workshops and specialist sessions, you will have opportunities to develop practical digital skills such as using AI responsibly, creating professional online profiles, managing your digital footprint, and using industry-standard productivity tools. These skills will help prepare you for university, apprenticeships and the modern workplace.

Luckley will facilitate individual development through advising on free training with external MOOC (online) resources. Whether it is coaching sport, working in hospitality, mental health first-aid or developing essential workplace skills, these experiences will help you to build confidence, independence and employability.

MAKING INFORMED CHOICES

Our Post-18 Guidance Programme is designed around you, helping you make confident and informed decisions about your future. Whether you are considering university, an apprenticeship, employment or another pathway, you will receive personalised one-to-one guidance to explore your options and identify the route that

best matches your ambitions, interests and strengths.

Throughout Sixth Form you will benefit from expert support with researching courses and careers, preparing applications and meeting key deadlines. If you choose to apply to university, you will receive dedicated guidance through every stage of the UCAS process, including support with writing a standout personal statement and submitting the strongest possible application. Our goal is to ensure that every student leaves Sixth Form with a clear plan, the confidence to take their next step and the skills to succeed in their chosen future.

EXPLORE CAREER OPTIONS

Our Careers programme will help you explore the wide range of opportunities available after Sixth Form and make informed decisions about your future. Throughout your time in Sixth Form you will have access to lectures, workshops and events delivered by universities, employers, apprenticeship providers and gap-year organisations, giving you first-hand insight into the pathways

available to you.

By engaging directly with professionals, industry experts and education providers, you will gain a deeper understanding of different careers, sectors and routes into employment. These experiences will help you identify your interests, broaden your aspirations and develop a clearer vision for your future.

The programme will also help you understand the skills, qualifications and experiences that employers and universities value, enabling you to make informed choices and take positive steps towards achieving your ambitions.

Our Alumni Mentoring Scheme connects you with former students who have successfully progressed into a wide range of careers and industries. BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

FITNESS FOR LIFE

Looking after your physical health and wellbeing is an important part of performing at your best and maintaining a healthy balance between study and personal life.

As part of our Sixth Form programme, you will benefit from dedicated sport and wellbeing sessions, giving you the opportunity to stay active and enjoy time away from your studies. Games afternoons will include a range of activities, from team sports that promote teamwork and leadership to gym-based fitness sessions designed to help you achieve your personal health and fitness goals.

Alongside this, our wellbeing programme will provide opportunities to focus on your mental health, personal wellbeing and strategies for managing the demands of Sixth Form life.

To further encourage an active lifestyle and greater independence, we are delighted to have established a partnership with Energies Fitness in Wokingham. Students will enjoy a Thursday afternoon session in the gym, with trainer-led classes, exclusively for Luckley Sixth Form.

This partnership will enhance the Sixth Form Fitness for Life programme by providing students with access to a commercial gym environment, instructor-led fitness classes and expert guidance. The aim is to develop confidence, promote lifelong physical activity and broaden the range of high-quality Games provision available to Sixth Form students.

DRAMA

If you have a passion for drama, you can certainly express your creative talents here with our amazing performing arts theatre. All students can take part in school productions, whether in an acting role or working behind the scenes on lighting and sound, costumes or stage management. Regular House competitions give students the chance to display any hidden talents, such as the Musical Entertainment competition. Optional speech and drama lessons are on offer resulting in high levels of success in examinations.

MUSIC

If you are musical, you will adore our state-of-the-art music centre, with its acoustically superb performance hall, high tech recording studio and

bespoke practice/tuition rooms. Senior and Chamber Choirs are always looking for new members and tuition is available in both instruments and singing. Our students' success in the Associated Board examinations is always excellent (Grades 1 – 8). Termly concerts together with more informal events are held throughout the year creating a rich, varied and challenging musical programme.

ENRICHMENT

The need to balance academic studies with rich and varied experiences outside the classroom is always at the forefront of our minds. Many departments arrange trips to academic lectures, conferences and theatres to complement classroom studies. Residential trips in Biology and Geography have proved very successful, as have our cultural trips. There is also a wide range of clubs and activities on offer to enable you to explore and develop your talents and passions. The Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme and Combined Cadet Forces give you the opportunity to experience outdoor adventures whilst learning some valuable life skills such as basic first aid, navigation and outdoor cooking.

THE ADMISSIONS PROCESS

You will be invited to attend our Sixth Form Open Evening in the autumn term, followed by a Taster Day, when you can sample lessons in the subjects that you are considering studying in the Sixth Form.

TO APPLY

If you would like to apply for a place, your parents will need to complete our online application form and pay the £150 registration fee (£250 for overseas applicants).

Upon receipt of this, a reference request will be sent to your current school which will include confirmation of your predicted GCSE grades.

You will be invited to attend an interview with the Head, Mrs Gilding-Brant and Head of Sixth Form, Mrs Rumble, or Acting Head of Sixth Form, Mr Crosley. For overseas candidates, this will be arranged via video call.

On receipt of a satisfactory reference you will receive a letter offering a conditional place, with a formal acceptance form. A Sixth Form planning sheet will be included which you should complete with details of your subject choices.

You will need to return the planning sheet and formal acceptance, with a deposit of £1800 (this will be refundable against the final term's fees).

You will be required to email your final GCSE results to the School in August.

SCHOLARSHIPS

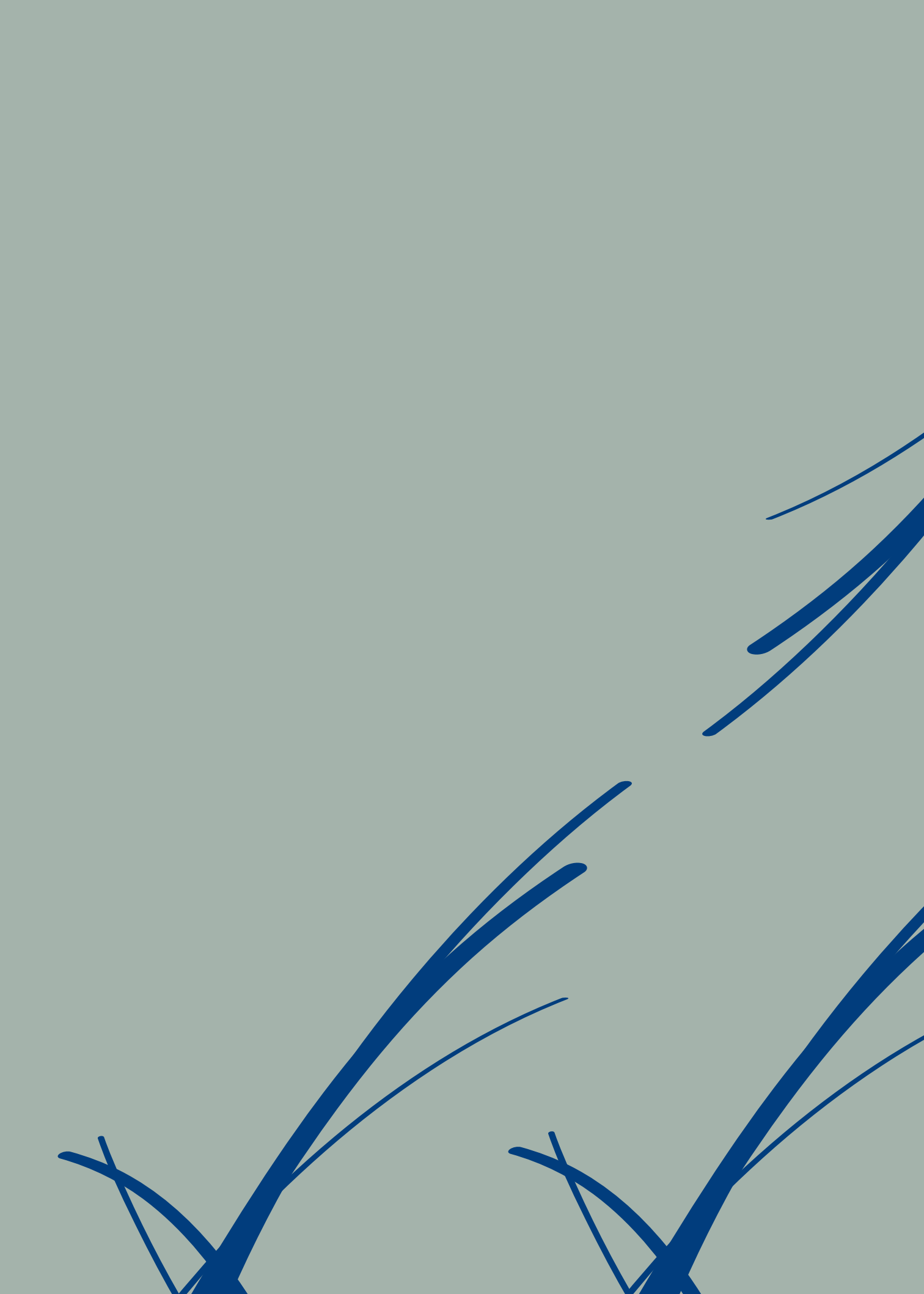
You will be sent details of our scholarship application process for Academic, Sport, Art, Drama and Music.

Current and prospective students are invited to apply for Academic Scholarships and awards in Art, Drama, Sport and Music. The examinations and assessments for these are held in the autumn term before admission.

ENTRY CRITERIA

Students wishing to join the Sixth Form at Luckley are expected to demonstrate the ability to achieve the minimum entry standards (six good grades at GCSE) and the potential to gain a Grade 6 at GCSE for your chosen subjects, with a Grade 7 in the Sciences or Maths.
